This must be paid at the time you leave your application form and is not refundable.

What happens next?

Your application will be taken to the next committee meeting. The committee meet every second Monday of each month. At the committee meeting it will be agreed if you are known by anyone, not known or your application refused.

Known.

If you are known by someone on the committee and there is no reason to refuse your application your name will be posted on the notice board for a period of 7 days, as the law requires.

If there are no objections from existing members to a reason why you should not be a member you may collect a key fob from the membership secretary.

Not known.

If you are not known then you will receive a letter from the membership secretary requesting you attend an interview. The interviews are held by the President and Membership Secretary.

If you fail to attend the interview you will be given one other date. Failure to attend the second interview will mean a refusal of your application.

Application refused.

You will receive a letter from the club secretary, following a committee meeting informing you of this decision.

How do I get a key fob?

A notice is placed on the notice following every committee meeting giving a date and time when the membership secretary, Lynda Dyson is available to allocate key fobs. Usually on a Thursday evening between 8pm and 9pm. Fobs must be collected and signed for by the applicant. This rule is strictly adhered to at all times.
